What is the NSPCC?



The 'National Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Children' is a charity campaigning & working in child protection in the United Kingdom & the Channel Islands. On a trip to New York in 1881, Liverpool businessman Thomas Agnew (1834–1924) visited the New York Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Children & was so impressed by the charity that he returned to England - determined to provide similar help for the children of Liverpool. In 1883 he set up the Liverpool Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Children (LSPCC). Other towns and cities began to follow Liverpool's example, leading on 11 July 1884 to the founding of the London Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Children (London SPCC) by Lord Shaftesbury, the Reverend Edward Rudolf and the Reverend Benjamin Waugh.
